4 Luke's Good News Chapter 1, verses 39-56

What kind of people does God involve in his story?

Mary must have been eager to consult the one person who might add to her understanding. Mary picked herself up and hurried to the hill country, to a town in Judea. She went into Zechariah's house and greeted Elizabeth. When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the baby in her womb jumped, and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit.
